A word from the founder...

A few years ago, before I began working with rescue organizations and shelters, I was completely unaware of the issues facing many of our nation's animals.

For example, I did not know that each year in the United States, an estimated 3-4 million* unwanted pets die needlessly in shelters... That's an average of 9,500 per day.

I did not know about the horrible commercial-breeding facilities (often referred to as puppy mills) where thousands of dogs are treated cruelly, live in deplorable conditions and are forced to breed over and over again to supply pet stores with inventory.

I did not know that on any given weekend, thousands of volunteers crisscross the nation to save lives by transporting homeless animals to safe destinations.

I did not know a lot of things. Why didn't I know? I had never been told. The information had never been presented to me. I found it because I looked for it. If I didn't know, how many others don't know either? I vowed to tell everyone what I had learned.
